Judge Morin's appointment to the Saskatchewan provincial court in 2001 hailed the introduction of the Cree language into the province's courtrooms, which represented a step toward mutual respect of Indigenous peoples and non-Indigenous people.

Raised in Cumberland House, northern Saskatchewan, prior to studying law, Judge Morin was a social worker for the government of Manitoba, working to improve lives in the province's First Nations communities.
