Legal Information, Legal Advice, and Access to Justice – The Distinction as it is Understood in the United States

Mr. Greacen will present on the distinction between legal information and legal advice as it is broadly understood and applied, including its relevance to policies pertaining to the unauthorized practice of law. He will situate the discussion about collaboration between library and justice stakeholders in the broader context of access to legal information and advice, by sharing insight on innovative initiatives in the United States which may help to inform and advance access to justice initiatives in Canada. Examples of initiatives that will be highlighted include American library and justice projects such as "Virtual Lawyers in the Library" and more broadly, new regulatory schemes for the provision of legal services such as those in Washington and Utah.
