
## Online Processes for Legal Claims: What the trend means for lawyers, judges and others in the justice system

Shannon Salter is the Chair of the Civil Resolution Tribunal and an adjunct professor at the UBC Allard School of Law, teaching administrative law and legal ethics. The Civil Resolution Tribunal in British Columbia – an online system – continues to expand its mandate, expecting a yearly caseload of 30,000 files and a budget of \$25 million. Shannon Salter will outline what the online management of a file looks like and share statistics and information about how people are experiencing the new tribunal

process. In the age of Jordan, processes such as these hold much appeal. On the other hand, they pressure lawyers, judges, and others involved in the justice system to re-evaluate the way things are done. Shannon will share her reflections on this trend toward change, and will engage the audience in conversation about what this all means for legal and administrative professionals.
